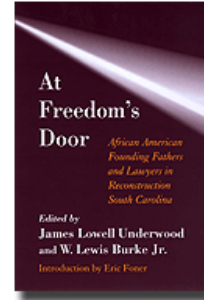

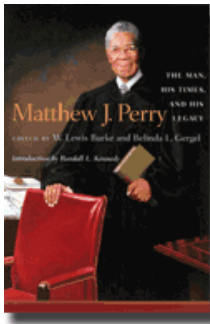

African-American Biographical Database (AABD) contains biographical sketches of thousands of African Americans (including photographs and illustrations) assembled from biographical dictionaries (1790-1950) and many other reference sources. Use AABD's Full Text Search to search its biographical sources by word or phrase, including personal name. Use its Profile Search to locate individual biographies by name, place of birth, date of birth, date of death, occupation, religion, gender, or source of information. AABD may be accessed from computers in the Law Library.
