Summer Reorganization

Summer is the time when we do a little housecleaning and rearranging in the library. If you have been into the first floor of the library recently, you have probably seen the book carts loaded with red plastic boxes and wondered what they were. They are the containers that we use to send material to remote storage in the Library Annex. Our Access Services librarian, Karen Taylor, and her crew are responsible for pulling the material and packing the boxes for shipment. We have sent all of our materials published before 1900, many of them rare, to the annex. We have also sent many duplicate items and sets to the annex. They are kept safely there in case we should ever need them as replacements. Items stored in the annex are easily retrievable, usually within 24 hours.

We are also currently shifting the legal periodicals to make better use of the shelf space on the first floor. Defunct periodicals are being moved to the fourth floor. That frees shelf space for adding to the active periodicals. Corporate Compliance Library - This two-part service helps you design, implement, and monitor an overall system of organizational compliance programs that qualify as effective under the U.S. Sentencing Guidelines for Organizational Defendant.

Digital Discovery & e-Evidence – This is a new information service on the evidentiary value of electronic data in litigation, providing in-depth intelligence and insights from leading courtroom and computer forensics experts.

Life Sciences Law & Industry Report – This broad-based notification service connects the dots among the many disciplines that make up the burgeoning life-sciences industry, with biweekly updates on current regulatory, legislative, and legal issues.

Medical Devices Law & Industry Report – This database provides in-depth, interdisciplinary biweekly news coverage of all major developments in the rapidly changing medical devices industry.

World Communications Regulation Report – This monthly report provides details of international regulation of communication technologies (land-line phone, mobile, handhelds, or desktop computer) giving insight into issues such as electronic signatures, data privacy, Internet governance, plus related legal issues such as antitrust and law enforcement measures (e.g., wiretapping).

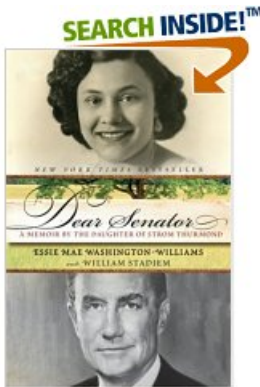

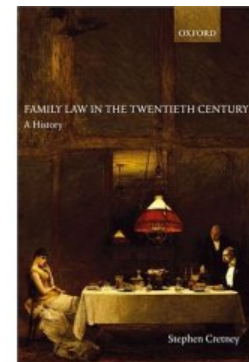
