I hereby claim my seat in, and confirm my commitment to take part in, the Law School's May, 2012, Maymester course entitled "Transnational Dispute Resolution" at Gray's Inn, London (the "Course"), a four-credit-hour classroom course taught in London, full tuition and fees amounting to \$3,500. I have read and understood and agree to the terms and conditions included in this letter and I have reviewed the Course website.

1. Commitment to enroll and pay tuition. I hereby ask the Law School Registrar to enroll me in the Course. I understand that the viability of the Maymester program depends upon a binding commitment from me, on which the Law School can rely, to pay the Course tuition and fees. **I understand that unless the Registrar receives written notice from me of my withdrawal from the Course (and forfeiture of my deposit) by 5 p.m. on March 1, 2012, I will be obligated to pay the tuition for the Course, even if I do not attend.**

2. Seat deposit. Accompanying this letter is a seat deposit in the amount of \$250, which I understand is non-refundable unless the course is cancelled by the Law School. (Checks should be made to the University of South Carolina). This amount will be credited toward my tuition. I understand that my seat is not reserved until the seat deposit is received by the Registrar.

3. Obligations. I understand that, if sufficient students enroll to make the Course financially viable, the Law School agrees to present the Course and, assuming my satisfactory completion thereof, award me the credit described above. The Course will be presented at Gray's Inn, London, and will be supervised by faculty of the Law School, at least one of whom will be present during the entire program. These are the Law School's only obligations. All matters as to international and local travel, lodging and other living arrangements, insurance of all kinds (including but not limited to health care insurance), passports, visas, meals, personal safety, and all other matters lying outside the obligations of the Law School described above are my own responsibility. I understand that I am required to have in effect appropriate health-care insurance that will cover me while outside the United States. I agree not to seek to hold the Law School, the University of South Carolina, Gray's Inn, or any agent or employee of any of them liable in any respect for any cost, loss or injury relating to any item of my own responsibility as just described. I understand the nature, risks, and complications of international travel. I have no personal physical or mental condition that would adversely affect my ability to engage in the program as described on the Course's web site or carry out appropriately my own responsibilities described above. I have had the opportunity to ask all questions that I deem material to engaging in the program and to carrying out the commitment made in this letter and have received satisfactory answers to those questions I have asked.

4. In addition to the Course, I expect (but understand that I am not committed) to register for (choose one):

- A 2012 summer-school course of at least two hours' credit
- A research paper of at least two hours' credit ("Legal Research III")
- Neither of the above

HOUSING APPLICATION FORM

I have completed and signed a Commitment Letter and Registration form for the School of Law 2012 London Maymester program and have submitted it to the Law School Registrar together with my non-refundable deposit of \$250. Its terms apply to this application.

I hereby apply for housing in London arranged by the Law School. I understand that the housing consists of shared, twin-bedded bedrooms in a suite with kitchen and bathroom, a sample of which is viewable on the program's website. I understand that the cost will be about \$1,200 for the duration of the program. This cost will vary according to the \$/£ exchange rate at the time of payment and according to availability. Accommodation will be provided beginning on the night of Friday, May 4, 2012, through and including the night of Friday, May 25, 2012. Participants can book additional days at additional cost directly with the landlord.

Attached, to secure my place, is my deposit of \$50 (make checks payable to the University of South Carolina) which I understand is non-refundable unless the Law School cancels the program. The balance of payment for housing will be charged on my tuition bill. I understand that my housing registration is not complete and no space is reserved for me until my deposit has been received by the Registrar.

If I am particular about my roommate and suitemates I agree to make those arrangements myself with other participants in the program and to notify Megan Seiner, Director of Student Affairs, of such arrangements.

In making this application I have not relied on any oral or written representations other than printed materials given me by the Law School or appearing on the Law School web site.
